BETWEEN INDIFFERENCE AND TOLERANCE

Throughout the region, CEFMUs are not part of the public agenda, registering very little progress in addressing and eradicating the issue through adequate and comprehensive public policies.


Although nearly all countries in the region have established 18 as the minimum legal age for marriage, practically all maintain exceptions.

In some cases, the minimum legal age is reduced to as low as 13 years with judicial authorization or maternal, paternal or guardian permission.

Countries where the minimum age is 18 vears without exceptions.

Countries with exceptions that allow marriage before the age of 18

- Persistence of ambiguous exceptions.
- Tolerance towards traditions and customs.
- Discriminatory rules.
- Legal gaps
- Lack of awareness among justice operators who allow exceptions.

As a result, there is a failure to comply with international standards.





CHALLENGES AND RECOMMENDATIONS

Addressing child marriage and early unions requires a comprehensive strategy that includes:



Generating data and disaggregated statistical information on CEFMU

Link local, regional, and national entities.






Moving towards the legal prohibition of exceptions in the law and social and cultural practices that enable or facilitate CEFMU.

Ensuring care for girls and adolescents who are already in a marriage or union.





Adopting comprehensive public policies for the prevention, attention, punishment, and eradication of CEFMU.







Public policies to end CEFMU should take an intersectional approach and promote the empowerment of girls and adolescents.



Strengthening the capacities of states to improve their approach to CEFMU.
